Name of Form:	Earnings Garnishment

Purpose of Form:	This form gives notice to the debtor and the garnishee of the commencement of the garnishment of earnings process. It provides the amount that is owed and gives the procedures for both the debtor and the garnishee to follow in complying with the garnishment.
Who Completes It:	The clerk of court will make the forms available. The clerk will put the court seal on the form when given to the creditor. The creditor will complete the boxed information on the form.
Distribution of Form:	Two originals are given to the creditor by the clerk of court in blank. The creditor fills in the boxed information and serves them on the debtor and garnishee.
Accompanying Forms:	The creditor must serve the following documents on the debtor at the time of service of this document: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Exemption Notice - Earnings Garnishment (CV-423)• Earnings Garnishment - Debtor's Answer (CV-424) or Garnishee Answer to Creditor (Earnings) SC-518• Garnishment Exemption Worksheet (CV-426)• Poverty Guidelines for Earnings (CV-427)
New Form/Modification:	Modified; last update 09/19.
Modifications:	Added, "as of date" in unpaid balance on judgment and post-judgment interest.
Comments:	<p>An earnings garnishment should include only one debtor. If there are multiple debtors in the underlying action, separate earnings garnishments should be completed for each debtor.</p> <p>The following comment is retained from the prior Form Summary: Although this notice is under the seal of the court, it is not intended to be signed by the clerk. Further, it is not intended that the clerk will fill in the boxed information. These documents will simply be made available in bulk in the clerk of court's office and distributed to the creditors upon payment of the statutory fee.</p>
