Name of Form: **Petition in Juvenile Court for Temporary Restraining Order and/or Petition and Motion for Injunction Hearing (Child Abuse – 30710)**

Form Number: **JC-1690**

Statutory Reference: §§48.25(6) and 813.122, Wisconsin Statutes

Benchbook Reference: JV 1; FA 15

Purpose of Form: To petition the juvenile court for an order to restrain somebody from committing child abuse and to schedule a hearing on an injunction. Use this form when:

1. The respondent is a child; or
2. There is a pending CHIPS action in the juvenile court involving the child victim.

If neither of these applies, use the civil form, CV-412 Petition in Civil Court for Temporary Restraining Order and/or Injunction (Child Abuse).

Who Completes It: Party who is seeking the restraining order.

Distribution of Form: Original to court, copies to petitioner and to respondent (by service), and law enforcement.

Accompanying Forms: Documents submitted to the court in support of the petition, plus a prepared copy of a Temporary Restraining Order for signing by the judge or court commissioner.

New Form/Modification: Modified; last update 06/22.

Modifications: Added request for interpreter language.

Comments: Available in Spanish.

If the TRO is denied, but the petitioner still wishes to have an injunction hearing, use form CV-447. If either a petitioner or a respondent wishes to request a de novo review of a circuit court commissioner's decision in a TRO or an injunction, use form CV-503.

There are two sets of forms for child abuse injunctions--a juvenile court set (JC-1690 to JC-1692) and civil court set (CV-412 to CV-414). The civil court set, with the documents filed with the clerk of court, are used in all cases unless one of the following two exceptions exist:

1. The respondent is a child; or
2. There is a pending CHIPS action in the juvenile court involving the child victim.

There is no filing fee in any child abuse action filed in adult or juvenile court in compliance with Act 272.
