On November 27, 2007, the Wisconsin Court of Appeals by Chief Judge Richard S. Brown, filed a petition to amend Wis. Stat. § (Rule) 809.18 governing voluntary dismissals of cases on appeal and creating a subsection which requires the parties to immediately notify the court that the matter has been compromised or settled.

IT IS ORDERED that a public hearing on the petition shall be held in the Supreme Court Room in the State Capitol, Madison, Wisconsin, on Friday, March 14, 2008, at 9:30 a.m.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the court's conference in the matter shall be held promptly following the public hearing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that notice of the hearing be given by publication of a copy of this order and of the petition in the official state newspaper once a week for three consecutive weeks and in an official publication of the State Bar of

Wisconsin not more than 60 days nor less than 30 days before the date of the hearing. 1
