Petitioners' response: No. To the best of my knowledge, after having discussed the question with a number of the petitioners, none has sought CLE credit for teaching a legal specialty course in an ABA approved paralegal program. Petitioners are unaware of any process available to make such a request. There is a process available to request CLE credit for teaching courses in an ABA approved law school.
