Purpose of Form:	Formal order of the court detailing the disposition in a delinquency case.
Who Completes It:	District attorney or court clerk.
Who Signs It:	BY THE COURT: Circuit Court Judge/Circuit Court Commissioner. THIS IS A FINAL ORDER FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPEAL IF SIGNED BY A CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE.
Distribution of Form:	Court, Juvenile's Guardian ad Litem/Adversary Counsel, Parents, Juvenile's Guardian/Legal Custodian/Trustee, District Attorney, and Caseworker.
Accompanying Forms:	Generally none, although there may be separate addenda concerning restitution orders, educational programs, rules of supervision, etc., depending on the individual case.
New Form/Modification:	Modification; last update 03/25.
Modifications:	Moved #4 under "The Court Finds," "As to the department or agency recommendation," to #3F because it is an out-of-home care finding.
Comments:	<p>Note that form JD-1745T, Dispositional Order with Termination of Parental Rights Notice - Delinquent, contains TPR Notice. TPR Notice should be provided for out-of-home cases and when a parent is denied periods of physical placement or visitation.</p> <p>The Records Management Committee (RMC) recommends that the court not rely upon attachments alone as the basis for its findings. Where attachments are used, specific reference to the document title, page and paragraph should be made.</p> <p>RMC has concerns that out-of-home placements ordered to be effective in the future may violate ASFA rules. One suggested procedure in these cases is to first enter a dispositional order placing the child at home, then revise the dispositional order pursuant to Wisconsin Statute § 938.363 upon the actual removal from the home. Another option is to adjourn the dispositional hearing until the actual removal date.</p>
