<b>Purpose of Form:</b>	To give notice to interested persons that a change in placement has taken or will take place.
<b>Who Completes It:</b>	Caseworker or district attorney/corporation counsel. Other parties use form JD-1766, Request to Change Placement.
<b>Distribution of Form:</b>	Court, Child/Juvenile, Child's/Juvenile's Guardian ad Litem/Adversary Counsel, Parents, Parents' Attorney(s), Child's Guardian/Legal Custodian, Relative Caregiver/Foster Parent, District Attorney/Corporation Counsel, Caseworker, and Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA).
<b>Accompanying Forms:</b>	Appropriate proposed order for change in placement.
<b>New Form/Modification:</b>	Modification; last update 10/25.
<b>Modifications:</b>	Added amended checkbox; added #10 – requesting ICPC delinquency findings for a juvenile; added § 938.988 to footer.
<b>Comments:</b>	<p>Section 801.15(1)(b) of the Code of Civil Procedure states that Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays shall be excluded when the time period prescribed is less than 11 days. See also <i>In Interest of F. Q.</i>, 162 Wis. 2d 607, 407 N.W.2d 1 (Ct. App. 1991).</p> <p>This form is intended to be used in both ch. 48 and ch. 938 matters.</p> <p>This form cannot be used for an in-home to out-of-home change in placement. For in-home to out-of-home, use form JD-1766, Request to Change Placement.</p> <p>The court is required to issue an order for all changes in placement, including those approved without a hearing.</p>
