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



### Questions to answer on your own:

- What date of birth (DOB) should be used if the defendant has been arrested multiple times and has used multiple dates of birth?
- What age do you use when: (a) a PSA was previously completed, (b) the defendant is arrested again on the same case (e.g., after failing to appear), and (c) the defendant is now older than he was when he was arrested the first time?
- What date of arrest and age do you use for someone who was booked and released, and were given a future Initial Appearance (IA) date? For example, if the person was 22 at the time of their arrest on February 2, 2018, and they were released with an Initial Appearance date of March 3, 2018, and they turned 23 in that time, what age do you use?



If defendant does not qualify for supervision, private pay SCRAM is an option depending upon program capacity.
