ORDER

WHEREAS, Governor Evers has declared a public health emergency for the State of Wisconsin due to COVID-19, the coronavirus that has brought about the pandemic that we are experiencing;

WHEREAS, all branches of Wisconsin government are working to contain the spread of COVID-19, while continuing to provide services to the people of Wisconsin;

WHEREAS, Wisconsin government is trying to limit person-to-person contact as one means of containing the spread of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court has oral arguments scheduled for March 18, 2020 and March 30, 2020 in the Supreme Court hearing room at the State Capitol, where visitors are seated in close contact during oral arguments;

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Supreme Court oral arguments are transmitted, live, by WisconsinEye, www.wiseye.org, where any interested person can view the proceedings.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that attendance in the hearing room at the aforementioned oral arguments will be limited to the Justices of the Supreme Court, attorneys who will argue the cases scheduled for oral argument, a member of WisconsinEye, Capitol Police and the Supreme Court Marshal.
