Pursuant to this Court's September 22, 2021 Order, as amended, proposed Intervenor-Petitioners Congressmen Glenn Grothman, Mike Gallagher, Bryan Steil, Tom Tiffany, and Scott Fitzgerald (the "Congressmen") submit this letter indicating that they do not oppose the intervention motions filed in the above-captioned case.* This Court granting these diverse intervention motions would facilitate its consideration of this dispute, as it would enable this Court to "resol[ve]" squarely "the critical legal and political issues" that "surround" Wisconsin's current redistricting cycle. *Jensen v.
