

## Becoming an electronic party on an existing case (Opting in as a self-represented party)

1. After registering for an eCourts account as a self-represented party, go to <u>https://efiling.wicourts.gov/</u> and enter your user name and password. Click **Log in**.

6. After the Opt in request has been electronically submitted it is transmitted to the clerk of circuit courts office. Court staff will process your request to opt in when both the payment and the request are received. Upon successful opt-in, you will receive an email notifying you that you are now an electronic notice (eNotice) party and the case will display in your **My cases** list. You will now be able to access all electronic documents and filed documents on the case.
