Purpose of Form: Order entering a family court order or modifying an existing family court order relating to paternity, legal custody, physical placement, visitation, child support or payment of health care expenses.

Who Completes It: Court.

Who Signs It: **BY THE COURT:** Circuit Court Judge/Circuit Court Commissioner.

Distribution of Form: Juvenile court file, family court file, family court to distribute to GAL in family court case, parents/parent attorneys in family court case, and child support agency.

Accompanying Forms: Case Closure Order, Form JD-1815 (Sealed in family court file.)

New Form/Modification: Modified; last update 05/18.

Modification: 2017 Wisconsin Act 203. Relocating and establishing a residence with a minor child more than 100 miles from the residence of the other party. Changed reasonable cost of health insurance of the insuring parent's monthly income available for child support from 5% to 10%.

Comments: 2015 Wisconsin Act 373. This form enters or modifies a family court order by virtue of a Case Closure Order in a juvenile case under Ch. 48 or Ch. 938. This form is to be prepared by the court hearing the juvenile court matter; however, only the family court case number and county shall be entered in the caption on this form. The juvenile court shall transmit a copy of this form along with a copy of Case Closure Order form (JD-1815) to the juvenile clerk for distribution to the parties. The Case Closure Order (JD-1815) shall be a sealed document in the family court file, unless otherwise specified by the family court judge. This supplemental form shall remain unsealed as a part of the family court record.

This form may only be used for a Case Closure Order.
