A Petition to Modify Guardianship was filed and a hearing was held. After consideration of the reports and other documents on file, all factors required by the statutes, and such additional information presented;

THE COURT FINDS:

2. MODIFICATION TO RIGHTS AND POWERS OF GUARDIAN OF PERSON AND ESTATE
