Comments: Civil version of the Juvenile form, CV-515.

Any juvenile adjudicated delinquent for a felony act committed on or after April 21, 1994, is restricted from possessing firearms. This restriction continues into adulthood unless a judge removes the restrictions. §941.29(8), Wis. Stats., provides for the individual to petition a court to remove the firearms restrictions. The statute does not limit the petition's filing to the county where the original adjudication

occurred.

RMC recommends filing as a juvenile action which maintains confidentiality. The burden is on the individual seeking the firearms restriction removal to show by a preponderance of the evidence that he or she is unlikely to act in a manner dangerous to public safety.
