<b>Modifications:</b>	Added “from a non-federally assisted program as defined in 42 CFR Part 2” to the section authorizing access to drug and alcohol records so that it is in compliance with the federal regulations on Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records (42 CFR Part 2).
<b>Comments:</b>	Split for eFiling, 05/16.  This form was recommended to RMC by the Chief Judges Guardian ad Litem Oversight subcommittee. This committee felt strongly that oversight of the GAL is necessary as it is the court’s duty to oversee the GAL’s performance of their obligations and duties, which is supported in case law ( <i>Paige K.B. v. Molepske, 219 Wis.2d 418, 580 N.W.2d 289 (1998)</i> ) and the findings from the Children’s Court Initiative reviews.
