- The **IID** (Ignition Interlock Device) surcharge of \$50 is included on all fines **except** for 1st offenses with a BAC below .15. §343.301(5).
- **IID** is **MANDATORY** for all vehicles registered in defendant's name §343.301(1g), **unless** doing so would cause a financial hardship. §343.301(1m).
- Refusal Penalties apply to breath cases only. If Blood Refusal and test, use the test result. If Blood Refusal and NO test use Below .15. Birchfield v. North Dakota, 136 S. Ct. 2160 (2016).
- **Probation:** (up to 2 years) available for 2nd and 3rd offenses if at least the minimum mandatory jail is imposed as a condition. §973.09(1) (d) & § 973.09(2) (am).
- **DNA surcharge** included for 2nd and 3rd offenses. §973.046(1r).
- Court **prohibited** from staying sentences for 3rd and subsequent offenses. §973.15(8)(a)3.
- 3rd Offense with at minor passenger is a felony. §346.65(2)(f)2.
- 4th Offense OWI became a felony for offense dates beginning 1/1/17 (15 Wis. Act 371)
- Penalty Enhancers for Fines: Assessed on the base fine. State v. Neill, 2020 WI 15
 - o **2**nd offense and above w/minor child: doubles §346.65(2)(f)2
 - o 3rd offense and above §346.65(2)(g)3

 w/.20 - .249: triples
 w/.25+: quadruples
