The Court, by its Clerk and Commissioners, has entered the following order:

Terrance D. Leflore, pro se, filed a document captioned "petition for writ of mandamus pursuant to WIS. STAT. § 783.01" in this court, seeking to compel an employee of the State Public Defenders Office to provide him with requested post-conviction discovery related to Walworth County Case No. 2018CF0463. Because Leflore did not commence a mandamus action in the circuit court, the petition is subject to this court's supervisory writ jurisdiction under WIS. STAT. § 809.71(1), which directs that "[a] petition in the supreme court shall show why it was impractical to seek the writ in the court of appeals or, if a petition had been filed in the court of appeals, the disposition made and reasons given by the court of appeals." Leflore's petition does not allege that he first sought relief in the court of appeals or explain why it was impractical to do so. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Terrance D. Leflore's petition for writ of mandamus is hereby dismissed.
