NO. 2026XX1557-D OFFICE OF LAWYER REGULATION V. HANNAH C. DUGAN

July 22, 2026

The Court, by its Commissioners, has entered the following order:

The Office of Lawyer Regulation (OLR) has filed a motion for the summary suspension of the license of Attorney Hannah C. Dugan to practice law in Wisconsin pursuant to Supreme Court Rule (SCR) 22.20. The OLR states the ground for the motion is Attorney Dugan's conviction of a "serious crime" as defined in SCR 22.20(2), specifically a federal felony conviction for Obstruction of Proceedings before Departments, Agencies and Committees, contrary to 18 U.S.C. § 1505. *United States v. Dugan*, E.D. Wis. Case Number 25-CR-89. The OLR states this felony conviction satisfies the standard for a summary suspension under SCR 22.20. Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that, pursuant to SCR 22.20, Attorney Hannah C. Dugan show cause, in writing, to this court within 20 days of the date of this order why the OLR's motion should not be granted and her license to practice law in Wisconsin should not be summarily suspended.
