No. 2019AP1526-CR      State v. Conley L.C. #2019CF45

On January 13, 2020, defendant-appellant, Kimeo D. Conley, pro se, filed a motion asking this court to permit Conley to bypass the court of appeals. He believes “the review of my brief has taken too long.” The court declines to permit bypass under Wis. Stat. s. 809.61. The court notes that “[a] party may file with the supreme court a petition to bypass the court of appeals pursuant to s. 808.05 no later than 14 days following the filing of the respondent's brief under s. 809.19 or response.” Wis. Stat. § (Rule) 809.60(1). The respondent's brief was filed on July 2, 2020, in the court of appeals, making any petition to bypass due 14 days thereafter, i.e., by July 16, 2020. Defendant-appellant filed the petition to bypass on January 13, 2020—195 days after the respondent's brief was filed in the court of appeals. We decline, moreover, to require the court of appeals to expedite its review of this matter. Upon the foregoing,
