A petition for a supervisory writ and a motion for a temporary stay of the proceedings in the Kenosha County circuit court while this court considers the writ petition having been filed on behalf of petitioner, State ex rel. Ezequiel Lopez-Quintero, and the court noting that there is an evidentiary hearing scheduled for 9:30 a.m. tomorrow morning in the circuit court;

IT IS ORDERED that the motion for a temporary stay and the petition for a supervisory writ are denied, ex parte. Three justices would deny both the motion and the petition for a supervisory writ. Three justices would grant the motion for a temporary stay without deciding the petition for a supervisory writ and would order a response to the writ petition from the respondent, Circuit Court for Kenosha County, and from the plaintiff in the underlying criminal action
