Greene v. Boughton L.C. #2018CV2773

On March 31, 2021, this court issued an order construing the "Notice of Appeal" filed by petitioner-appellant, Jeremy T. Greene, pro se, on March 22, 2021, as a timely but nonconforming petition to review the court of appeals' decision of February 12, 2021, which it declined to reconsider by order of March 25, 2021. The order directed Mr. Greene to file a statement in support of the petition, conforming to the requirements of Wis. Stat. §§ 809.62(2) and (4), by April 30, 2021.

On May 3, 2021, the court received a "Motion for the Enlargement of Time to File Arguments in the Necessary Support of Petition for Review." In that motion, Mr. Greene asks for additional time to complete his statement in support.

IT IS ORDERED that the motion is granted. Defendant-appellant, Jeremy T. Greene, pro se, may file his statement in support of the petition for review filed March 4, 2021, conforming to the requirements of Wis. Stat. §§ 809.62(2) and (4), by May 20, 2021. Mr. Hyatt is advised that this is a one-time exception to the admonition in our March 31, 2021 order that no further time extensions would be granted. No extensions of the May 20, 2021 deadline will be permitted, and a failure to meet this deadline will result in summary dismissal.
