State v. Hyatt L.C.#2014CF57

On March 11, 2021, the court issued an order construing the "petition for review and declaration" filed March 4, 2021 by defendant-appellant, Jason J. Hyatt, pro se, as a timely but nonconforming petition for review of the court of appeals' decision of February 10, 2021. The order directed Mr. Hyatt to file a statement in support of the petition, conforming to the requirements of Wis. Stat. §§ 809.62(2) and (4), by April 12, 2021.

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On March 22, 2021, the court received "Appellant's Statement in Support of Petition for Review." In the statement, Mr. Hyatt "requests to rescind his would-be petition for review; and request[s] that . . . he be granted additional time as necessary to complete a conforming petition." The court construed that statement to be a motion for an extension of time to file the statement in support of Mr. Hyatt's March 4, 2021 timely but nonconforming petition for review.

On March 30, 2021, the court granted Mr. Hyatt's motion and directed Mr. Hyatt to file an additional statement in support of the petition for review conforming, to the requirements of Wis. Stat. §§ 809.62(2) and (4), by April 30, 2021. Mr. Hyatt was advised that that was a one-time exception to the admonition in the March 11, 2021 order that no further time extensions would be granted; that no further extensions of the April 30, 2021 deadline would be permitted; and that failure to meet that deadline would result in summary dismissal.

As of the date of this order, Mr. Hyatt has not filed any additional documents with the court. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the petition for review filed by defendant-appellant, Jason J. Hyatt, pro se, is summarily dismissed.
