Puchner v. Circuit Court for Waukesha Cty. L.C.#2019FA89

Puchner asks this court to review the court of appeals' May 10, 2021 decision denying a supervisory writ petition that Mr. Puchner filed in that court. At the conclusion of the document, Mr. Puchner writes: "Signed[] electronically[,] John[] Puchner, M.D."

IT IS ORDERED that the petition for review is dismissed. Petitions for review must be physically filed in the clerk of court's office within the time period required under Wis. Stat. §§ 808.10 and 809.62(1m). See First Wisconsin Nat. Bank of Madison v. Nicholaou, 87 Wis. 2d 360, 274 N.W.2d 704 (1979). Petitions for review must also be filed on paper along with the required number of copies; signed with a handwritten signature; and served via paper copy by traditional methods. See Wis. Stat. §§ 802.05(1); (Rule) 809.62(4); 809.80(1), (2), (3). Nothing in this court's orders regarding appellate court operations during the COVID-19 pandemic alters these requirements. Mr. Puchner's email submission satisfies none of them.
