You are hereby notified that the Court, by its Clerks and Commissioners, has entered the following order:

No. 2019XX1772-CR State v. Prouty L.C.#2019CF767

On February 10, 2020, this court construed a January 2, 2020 filing by defendant, Scott Prouty, pro se, entitled "Prouty seeks relief from Judgment," as a timely petition for review of the court of appeals' decision of December 5, 2019. Also on February 10, 2020, the clerk of this court issued a separate order stating that the petition for review would be dismissed unless, within 10 days, Mr. Prouty submitted the \$195.00 filing fee or filed a petition for waiver of the prepayment of the filing fee showing good cause why the filing fee should be waived. Mr. Prouty has submitted neither the \$195.00 filing fee nor a completed petition for waiver of the filing fee, and more than 10 days have passed from the February 10, 2020 order.

In addition, on February 21, 2020, Mr. Prouty filed a document entitled "Motion for Judicial Review," which referenced Wis. Stat. § 227.52 and which purported to seek an immediate

interlocutory appeal in this court of certain rulings by the circuit court in State v. Prouty, Waukesha County Case No. 2019CF767. Upon the foregoing,

IT IS ORDERED that the petition for review of the court of appeals' decision of December 5, 2019, is dismissed for failure to submit the \$195.00 filing fee or to file a completed petition for waiver of prepayment of filing fee that showed good cause to waive the filing fee, as required by the court's February 10, 2020 order; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that February 21, 2020 "Motion for Judicial Review" is dismissed. Wisconsin Statute § 227.52 applies to judicial review of certain administrative decisions. It does not authorize judicial review of interlocutory decisions by a circuit court in a criminal proceeding. In addition, there is no other legal authority by which Mr. Prouty may seek, by motion, an interlocutory appeal of circuit court decisions in a criminal proceeding directly in this court.
