On April 6, 2020, defendant, Jason G. Fry, by his lawyer, Attorney Frederick B. Melms, filed a motion in this court entitled "Emergency Request For Modifications Relating To COVID-19 Pandemic."

On April 9, 2020, this court ordered Mr. Fry to clarify, within seven calendar days, the types of relief he is requesting, the legal basis for that relief, the parties from whom he seeks such relief, the legal basis by which he invokes this court's jurisdiction, and the manner in which he intends to address the amount of filing fees owed.

On April 17, 2020, Mr. Fry responded by filing a "Motion For Writ Of Mandamus." By filing this petition for writ of mandamus, Mr. Fry has effectively abandoned the "Emergency Request For Modifications Relating To COVID-19 Pandemic" referenced above.
