IT IS ORDERED that the petition is dismissed, along with the motion to stay. This court will not exercise its supervisory jurisdiction where there is an adequate alternative remedy. See generally Wis. Stat. § 809.71 and accompanying Judicial Council Committee's Note, 1981. In accordance with this rule, a supervisory writ petition filed in this court must "show why it was impractical to seek the writ in the court of appeals or, if a petition had been filed in the court of appeals, the disposition made and reasons given by the court of appeals." § 809.71. After the court of appeals issues its final decision in No. 2021AP134-CR, Mr. Delk may seek review in this court of that decision via a petition for review. Finally, we note that, to the extent that Mr. Delk's current petition seeks review of the court of appeals' July 13, 2021 order pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 808.10, any such review is impermissible. The subject of a petition for review must be the final decision of the court of appeals, In Interest of A.R., 85 Wis. 2d 444, 270 N.W.2d 581 (1978), and as we have explained, the court of appeals has not yet rendered its final decision.
