Richard Teigen v. Wisconsin Elections Commission,
L.C. #2021CV958

On February 17, 2022, intervenors-defendants-appellants, Disability Rights Wisconsin, League of Women Voters of Wisconsin, and Wisconsin Faith Voters for Justice ("Intervenors"), filed a motion for leave to supplement the record with the affidavits of nine municipal clerks, who aver that their communities have used drop boxes for years, long predating the COVID-19 pandemic. The Intervenors also seek leave to supplement the record with a memorandum issued by the Wisconsin Elections Commission (WEC) on February 16, 2022, in compliance with the circuit court order issued in this matter on January 19, 2022. On February 28, 2022, the plaintiffs-respondents-petitioners filed a response opposing the motion to supplement the record, objecting to the proffered affidavits but stating nothing about the WEC's February 16, 2022 memorandum.

IT IS ORDERED that the motion to supplement the record is granted in part and denied in part. The motion is denied to the extent that it seeks to supplement the record with nine affidavits of municipal clerks. It is granted to the extent that it seeks to supplement the record with the February 16, 2022 memorandum issued by the Wisconsin Elections Commission; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that because oral argument in this matter is scheduled on April 13, 2022, the parties are directed to comply with the existing briefing schedule. Requests for briefing extensions will be viewed with disfavor and all briefs are to be filed no later than March 30, 2022.
