No. 2018AP2005-CR State v. Barnes L.C. #2013CF118

A petition for review filed by defendant-appellant, Garland Dean Barnes, was ordered held in abeyance pending the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in Hemphill v. New York, U.S. Case No. 20-637. The decision in that case was issued on January 20, 2022. On February 22, 2022, this court received a letter from attorneys for defendant-appellant-petitioner citing the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in Hemphill as a supplemental authority and moving that this court grant the petition for review and summarily reverse the decision of the court of appeals, or grant the petition and reverse and remand. The State has not yet responded to the letter.

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff-respondent, State of Wisconsin, shall file a letter/brief by March 14, 2022, discussing the impact of the Hemphill case and responding to the defendant-appellant's motion.
