ADS Waste Holdings, Inc. v. Labor and Industry Review Comm'n
L.C.#2020CV208

On March 7, 2022, plaintiffs-respondents-petitioners ADS Waste Holdings, Inc. and Arch Insurance Co. (collectively, "the petitioners") filed a petition for review in this matter, which remains pending. On March 22, 2022, the petitioners filed a "Request For Remand To Division Of Hearings And Appeals For Approval Of Compromise Agreement." The petitioners report that they and defendant-appellant Matthew Markowski have reached a settlement of Mr. Markowski's claims, and thus, the petitioners and Mr. Markowski "request[]" that this case be remanded to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, Office of Worker's Compensation Hearings for approval of the compromise agreement, which will be drafted shortly and submitted to the Division upon

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remand.” On March 24, 2022, defendant-appellant Labor and Industry Review Commission filed a document stating that it “does not oppose the other parties’ request for a remand.”

IT IS ORDERED that, within fourteen calendar days of the date of this order, the petitioners shall file a letter with this court explaining: (1) whether a remand to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, Office of Worker’s Compensation Hearings, is legally required; and (2) what authority would allow this court, before deciding whether to grant the petition for review and exercise appellate jurisdiction, to remand this case to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, Office of Worker’s Compensation Hearings. Cf. Wis. Stat. § (Rule) 809.26.
