Office of Lawyer Regulation v. Paul Boltz

The court, on its own motion, having become aware of information that Attorney Paul A. Boltz may have already made partial or full payment of restitution to P.D. in connection with a criminal action in the Brown County circuit court and may have health issues that raise concerns about possible medical incapacity;

IT IS ORDERED that the Office of Lawyer Regulation shall investigate whether Attorney Paul A. Boltz has made restitution payments to P.D. and the total amount of any such payments and shall file a supplemental statement on restitution.

Office of Lawyer Regulation v. Paul Boltz

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Office of Lawyer Regulation shall attempt to communicate, preferably in person or telephonically, with Attorney Paul A. Boltz or someone authorized to speak on his behalf regarding whether Attorney Boltz wishes to claim that he has a medical incapacity that makes the defense of this disciplinary proceeding impossible under SCR 22.16(4).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Office of Lawyer Regulation shall file a report with the court on or before February 18, 2019, advising the court of its attempts to communicate with Attorney Boltz about restitution payments and medical incapacity and whether Attorney Boltz wishes to claim or appears to have a reasonable basis to claim that he has a medical incapacity that makes the defense of this disciplinary proceeding impossible.
