On October 19, 2022, defendant-appellant, Robert Lee Hamilton, pro se, filed with the clerk of this court a document entitled "Motion for Wisconsin Supreme Court To Deem This Motion as a Timely Filed Petition For Review." With this motion Mr. Hamilton filed what could be construed as a petition for review and supporting appendix. In the motion document Mr. Hamilton asked for this court to: 1) Send him necessary forms to obtain a waiver of the filing fee; 2) tell him if his petition for review meets the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 809.62; and 3) allow him additional time to file a petition for review conforming to the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 809.62. The court notes that on September 28, 2022, the clerk of this court sent Mr. Hamilton a petition for review filing guide and then on October 19, 2022, they sent him the proper forms to determine indigency. IT IS ORDERED that court will take no action on defendant-appellant's request to inform him if his petition for review meets the applicable filing requirements. He has received all guides and forms needed to properly file a petition for review conforming to the requirements of Wis. Stat. §§ 809.62(2) and (4); and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the document received on October 19, 2022 shall be construed as a petition for review and is accepted as filed; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that defendant-appellant shall have until November 4, 2022, to either pay the filing fee or file the Petition for Waiver of Fees/Costs-Affidavit of Indigency and the Authorization to Withhold Money from Trust Fund Accounts that were sent to him on October 19, 2022, as well as a certified copy of his trust fund account statement for the previous six-month period. If the fee or waiver is not received by the November 4, 2022 deadline the petition for review will be dismissed.
