Wisconsin Supreme Court:

If necessary, construe this as an untitled motion. However, it reads best as a letter. I will state my request, support my request, then clarify it at the end.

I ask that the two Courts, Wisconsin Supreme Court and Court of Appeals speak with each other and decide who is actually responsible for deciding my recent motions. Essentially, each court has "passed the buck", and logic dictates that at least one court has jurisdiction.

In early August, 2022, I filed motions for extension of time, ineffective counsel and appointment of new counsel. I alleged ineffective counsel at the Wisconsin Supreme Court level. I filed with this court after the Court of Appeals denied similar motions, with one reason being they lacked jurisdiction.

This court's even briefer denial also stated it wasn't the right place to file.

It is noteworthy that neither motion was time-barred, and also noteworthy that I had to write Clerk Kennedy twice to determine if/ when a ruling were made on this court's motion.

I am writing this within a reasonable timeframe after learning of the denial, so I ask for a time waiver, as I would have filed sooner had I known. Further, it is likely that a "proper" motion was filed previously, as logic dictates one court (at least) has jurisdiction.

Please re-read my motion (and possibly my motion to the Court of Appeals) and do one of the following: If it becomes apparent that this court was the proper place to file for ineffective counsel at the Wisconsin Supreme Court level, please issue a ruling based on that fact.

OR

If it makes sense, please provide a deadline/ timeline for filing a new motion, and tell me which court (or both) would be the proper place to file.

While that may seem to be "legal advice", as I tried both courts I consider it to be a "fact", such as an address or a deadline.
