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You are hereby notified that the Court, by its Clerk and Commissioners, has entered the following order:

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No. 2020AP816-CRNM State v. Carpenter, L.C.#2017CF301

Pending before the court is a petition for review filed by Joshua J. Carpenter, pro se. Before the court will consider Mr. Carpenter's petition for review, a corrected petition must be filed in this court. Wisconsin Stat. § 809.86 requires appellate briefs, *petitions for review*, and responses to petitions for review to identify crime victims by use of identifiers unless there is good cause for noncompliance. The petition filed by Mr. Carpenter uses the victim's full name, which is not permitted by statute, and the filing provides no reason for noncompliance with the statute. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that in order to protect the identity of the crime victim, the Clerk of the Supreme Court shall place the petition for review filed in this matter on December 5, 2022, under

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seal, and it shall remain under seal until further order of the court. Wis. Stat. § 809.86 (5) (“the court may make any order necessary to protect the identity of a victim or other person, or to excuse compliance with this section....”);

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, within 60 days of the date of this order, the petitioner is directed to file one (1) substitute copy of the petition for review in which the name of the victim shall be redacted. The petitioner may use the existing petition for review and may redact the full name of the victim anywhere it appears in the petition using a black marker or other means and shall refer to the victim by one or more initials or other appropriate pseudonym or designation (i.e. “K.S.”);

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon receipt of the redacted or corrected petition for review, the court will consider the materials submitted in connection with this matter and a decision will issue in due course.
