On October 23, 2019, respondent-appellant, Crypticion Priest, filed a "Pro Se Brief of Petitioner" in this court. The court has construed this filing as a petition for review of the court of appeals' June 17, 2019 decision adverse to Mr. Priest.

IT IS ORDERED that the petition for review is dismissed as untimely. A petition for review must be physically filed with the clerk of this court within 30 days after the date of the court of appeals' final decision. Wis. Stat. § 808.10(1); First Wisconsin Bank of Madison v. Nicholaou, 87 Wis. 2d 360, 274 N.W.2d 704 (1979). Although this 30-day filing period is tolled

by the timely filing of a motion for reconsideration in the court of appeals, see Wis. Stat. § 808.10(2) and § (Rule) 809.24(1), Mr. Priest did not file a timely motion for reconsideration, as the court of appeals explained in its September 16, 2019 order. Because Mr. Priest filed his petition for review well outside of 30 days after the date of the court of appeals' June 17, 2019 decision, the petition must be dismissed as untimely.
