No. 2022XX1581-BA Board of Bar Examiners v. R.S.S.

On October 5, 2021, Attorney Rodrigo F. Sanchez Sandoval executed a Consent Agreement for Conditional Admission and, based on that consent agreement, was conditionally admitted to practice law in Wisconsin on October 26, 2021. Attorney Sandoval's license to practice law was expressly conditioned upon his compliance with certain requirements for a period of five years from the date of his admission to practice. See SCR 40.075(4).

On December 15, 2022, the Board of Bar Examiners (BBE) filed a notice of motion, motion, and supporting affidavit informing this court that the BBE voted to revoke Attorney Sandoval's conditional admission agreement because of his repeated failure to abide by its terms. SCR 40.075(7). On January 11, 2023, this court ordered Attorney Sandoval to show cause, in writing, why the BBE's motion should not be granted.¹ Attorney Sandoval has not filed a response to the order to show cause.

¹ Our order directed that all filings in this matter, including the name of the respondent, should remain confidential until further order of the court, consistent with SCR 40.075(9). The order advised Attorney Sandoval, however, that if the BBE's motion was granted, the ensuing order would be public and would be disclosed to the State Bar of Wisconsin. SCR 40.075(9)(h). The order warned Attorney Sandoval that this court was considering revoking his law license.

No. 2022XX1581-BA Board of Bar Examiners v. R.S.S.

The court has reviewed the materials submitted in this matter and agrees with the BBE's determination that Attorney Sandoval is not in compliance with the terms of his conditional admission. If a conditionally admitted lawyer fails to fulfill the terms of a conditional admission agreement, that failure may result in a modification, extension, or revocation of the agreement or such other action as may be appropriate, including notice to the Office of Lawyer Regulation. SCR 40.075(7). Here, the BBE voted to revoke Attorney Sandoval's conditional admission agreement.

Attorney Sandoval's failure to comply with the terms of his conditional admission warrants revocation of the Consent Agreement for Conditional Admission. Further, the court determines that Attorney Sandoval's license to practice law in Wisconsin should be revoked.²

IT IS ORDERED that the Board of Bar Examiners' motion is granted. Attorney Rodrigo F. Sanchez Sandoval's license to practice law in Wisconsin is revoked, pursuant to SCR 40.075(7m), for failure to fulfill the terms of the conditional admission agreement. Attorney Rodrigo F. Sanchez Sandoval is no longer licensed to practice law in Wisconsin, effective April 18, 2023;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Attorney Rodrigo F. Sanchez Sandoval shall comply with the requirements of SCR 22.26 relating to license revocation; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, with the exception of this order, all filings in this matter shall remain confidential and will be retained under seal until further order of the court.

² The status of Attorney Rodrigo F. Sanchez Sandoval's license will be noted on the State Bar website as "Revoked." We note that Attorney Rodrigo F. Sanchez Sandoval's revocation is not the result of an attorney disciplinary proceeding but due to noncompliance with the terms of his conditional admission.
