**ORDER FOLLOWING MAY 4, 2023 PRETRIAL
CONFERENCE**

A telephonic Pretrial Conference was held in this matter at 2:00 PM on May 4, 2023. Jonathan E. Hendrix appeared on behalf of the Office of Lawyer Regulation (OLR); the Respondent, Vladimir Gorokhovsky, appeared on behalf of himself.

OLR previously filed a motion under Wis. Stat. s. 807.13, to be allowed to call a witness by live audiovisual means. That motion is granted subject to OLR demonstrating good cause under that statute when the witness is called.

The Respondent filed an objection to the introduction into evidence of certain unidentified documents that he alleges relate to a witness he claims will not appear at the Hearing. As with all evidence offered, a decision on admissibility cannot generally be made until the time the evidence is offered.

He can make his objection to any documentary evidence at such time.

The Respondent also requested a 30-60 day delay of the hearing in order to obtain a video he claims is in the possession of a social media outlet and which he alleges will support his defense. He has had almost 3 years to obtain such video and never sought the use of a subpoena to obtain it. Thus there is no good cause to delay this proceeding. Should he obtain the video before the Referee's Report and Recommendation is filed with the Supreme Court he can bring it to the attention of the Referee and request a hearing on additional evidence.

The Hearing in this matter will commence at 9:00 AM on Monday, May 8, 2023 at the Offices of Quarles & Brady LLP, 411 E Wisconsin Avenue, Suite 2400, Milwaukee, WI 53202-4828.
