Office of Lawyer Regulation v. Erick R. Tyrone

On September 26, 2023, in response to a statement by the Office of Lawyer Regulation (OLR) that the parties were working on a stipulation in this reciprocal discipline matter filed under Supreme Court Rule (SCR) 22.22, this court ordered the parties to file a joint written report advising the court of the status of the potential stipulation. On October 4, 2023, the OLR filed a status report, in which it states that Attorney Tyrone has not responded to a proposed stipulation that the OLR sent to him on August 18, 2023. The OLR's status report requests that a referee not be appointed for an additional 30 days to give Attorney Tyrone an opportunity to respond to OLR's proposed stipulation. (The court again notes that a referee generally is not appointed in a reciprocal discipline matter under SCR 22.22.) Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that the matter is held in abeyance until November 9, 2023.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if no stipulation is filed by November 9, 2023, by that date the parties shall jointly inform this court, in writing, of the status of any stipulation, including the approximate date by which they intend to file such a stipulation. If the parties at that time ask the court for the matter to be held in abeyance for a further period of time, they shall explain, with specificity, what good cause exists for a further period of abeyance.
