Puchner v. Cir. Ct. of Waukesha Cnty., L.C.#2019FA89

On May 30, 2023, petitioner, John D. Puchner, pro se, filed a petition for supervisory writ. On October 18, 2023, this court issued an order dismissing the writ petition due to Mr. Puchner's failure to file a certified copy of his trust account statement as required by Wis. Stat. § 814.29(1m)(b)2.

On October 20, 2023, and on October 23, 2023, Mr. Puchner, pro se, filed motions which ask this court, among other things, to reopen his writ proceeding and issue a restraining order against the Waukesha County Jail.

IT IS ORDERED that the motion to reopen the writ proceeding is denied. In addition to not furnishing a certified copy of his trust account statement, the petitions for waiver of fees/costs previously submitted by Mr. Puchner are deficient in that they do not list his salary. While Mr. Puchner asserts that he works at McDonald's but earns "0 gross" every two weeks because "all goes to Huber & child support," this is not an accurate statement of earnings. The petition for waiver of fees must list the amount of wages Mr. Puchner earns from employment at McDonald's and any other employer. The fact that Mr. Puchner may be obligated to pay certain sums for child

support and/or participation in the Huber program does not eliminate the need for him to accurately state his gross wages; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the motion for a restraining order and all other accompanying requests for relief are dismissed as moot.
