State v. Wilson, L.C.#1999CF5019

The court having considered the motion of defendant-appellant, Charles Wilson, pro se, to extend the time in which to file a petition to review the court of appeals' decision of March 19, 2024;

IT IS ORDERED that the motion is denied. The 30-day period in which to file a petition for review may not be enlarged. First Wisconsin National Bank of Madison v. Nicholaou, 87 Wis. 2d 360, 274 N.W.2d 704 (1979); and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the motion itself shall be deemed to be a timely but nonconforming petition for review. However, a statement in support of the petition, conforming to the requirements of Wis. Stat. §§ 809.62(2) and (4), must be filed with the clerk of this court by April 26, 2024. If the statement is not filed by that time, this petition will be summarily dismissed. The court notes that effective July 1, 2023, paper filers in the supreme court are required to submit just a single copy of each filing to the clerk of this court. Wis. Stat. § (Rule) 809.80(1). Consequently, defendant-appellant may file one copy of his statement in support of the petition for review on or before April 26, 2024. Defendant-appellant is reminded, however, that
