No. 2012AP2321-D Office of Lawyer Regulation v. Sean D. Cooper

On April 15, 2024, Sean D. Cooper filed a petition for reinstatement of his license to practice law in Wisconsin following the revocation of his license in December 2013, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule (SCR) 22.29(2). On June 27, 2024, the Office of Lawyer Regulation (OLR) filed a response to Mr. Cooper's petition, pursuant to SCR 22.30(4). The OLR's response stated that it has been unable to complete its investigation into Mr. Cooper's potential reinstatement due to Cooper's failure to comply with the court's reinstatement rules and procedures. Specifically, the OLR stated the Mr. Cooper had not: (1) served his petition on the OLR as required by SCR 22.29(3); (2) paid the filing fee as required by SCR 22.29(5); (3) communicated with or provided any additional information or materials to OLR or responded to OLR's April 23, 2024 communication regarding deficiencies in Mr. Cooper's reinstatement efforts; and (4) communicated with OLR in any way to rectify the identified deficiencies in this reinstatement materials. The OLR stated that because of the deficiencies, and because of the prevalence and severity of Mr. Cooper's underlying misconduct, it opposed his reinstatement and asked the court to dismiss the petition.¹

¹ On July 18, 2024, the OLR filed a letter with the court stating that Mr. Cooper had paid the filing fee required by SCR 22.29(5), but that he had, as yet, failed to rectify

On July 16, 2024, Mr. Cooper filed a letter with the court requesting an enlargement of time to complete the license reinstatement process and the tasks detailed by the OLR.

IT IS ORDERED that Sean D. Cooper's petition for reinstatement shall be held in abeyance pending further order of the court; and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that on or before December 2, 2024, Mr. Cooper shall file a written report with the court detailing the steps he has taken to complete the licensing reinstatement process; and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that that on or before December 16, 2024, the Office of Lawyer Regulation shall file an updated response to Mr. Cooper's reinstatement petition.
