Office of Lawyer Regulation v. Vladimir M. Gorokhovskiy

On August 2, 2023, Attorney Vladimir M. Gorokhovskiy filed an appeal of the referee's report in an attorney disciplinary matter. Attorney Gorokhovskiy filed, and this court granted, three motions for extension of time for him to file his opening brief. To date, this court has granted two extensions of time for Attorney Gorokhovskiy to file his reply brief. The most recent order, issued on September 3, 2024, directed Attorney Gorokhovskiy to file his reply brief by September 27, 2024, and informed him that if the reply brief was not filed by that date, the court would proceed with the matter based upon the documents submitted.

Attorney Gorokhovskiy has now filed a third extension motion titled "Appellant's Emergency Motion for Reconsideration and to Extend Time to File Reply Brief." In that motion, Attorney Gorokhovskiy asks for an additional 45 to 90 days to file his reply brief. He also requests that the matter be converted to e-filing or, in the alternative, that he be required to file three to six paper copies of the reply brief.

IT IS ORDERED that the motion to convert the matter to e-filing is denied. See S. Ct. Order 23-03, 2023 WI 47 (issued June 12, 2023, eff. July 1, 2023) ("any party to a judicial/attorney

proceeding in the Wisconsin Supreme Court . . . shall be considered to be a 'paper party' . . . and shall sign, file, and serve documents by 'traditional methods.'");

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the motion to reduce the number of paper copies filed is granted. Attorney Gorokhovsky shall file three paper copies of his reply brief; and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the motion to extend the time for filing the reply brief by 45 to 90 days is denied. Attorney Gorokhovsky shall file his reply brief on or before October 4, 2024. In the event the brief is not filed by that date, the court will take the matter under advisement based on the briefs on file. The court will not consider any additional extension motions.
