Braun v. Circuit Court for Walworth County, L.C#2023CF24

On April 8, 2025, Conrad Braun, pro se, filed a petition for writ of mandamus, asking this court to compel a court reporter to file certain transcripts relating to his criminal appeal in Case. No. 2024AP1929. Braun's filing comes after he filed several motions of a similar nature in the court of appeals. There are four requirements that must be met before a court may issue a writ of mandamus: "(1) a clear legal right; (2) a positive and plain duty; (3) substantial damages; and (4) no other adequate remedy at law." Law Enforcement Standards Bd. v. Lyndon Station, 101 Wis. 2d 472, 494, 305 N.W.2d 89 (1981).

Here, Braun has an "adequate remedy at law" before the court of appeals. In fact, the same day as Braun filed his petition for writ of mandamus, the court of appeals issued a delinquency notice to the court reporter at issue, ordering that "the transcript must be filed forthwith" under threat of sanctions. In other words, the court of appeals has already provided the relief that Braun seeks from this court. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Conrad Braun's petition for writ of mandamus is dismissed as moot.
