No. 2025AP341-W Browner v. Circuit Court for Fond du Lac County, L.C. #2022CF783

On March 6, 2025, petitioner Darius A. Browner filed a pro se petition for supervisory writ pursuant to Wis. Stat. § (Rule) 809.71.

IT IS ORDERED that the petition is dismissed. This court will not exercise its supervisory jurisdiction where there is an adequate alternative remedy. See generally Wis. Stat. § (Rule) 809.71 and accompanying Judicial Council Committee's Note, 1981. Therefore, "[a] person seeking a supervisory writ from the supreme court shall first file a petition for a supervisory writ in the court of appeals under s. 809.51 unless it is impractical to seek the writ in the court of appeals. A petition in the supreme court shall show why it was impractical to seek the writ in the court of appeals or, if a petition had been filed in the court of appeals, the disposition made and reasons given by the court of appeals." Wis. Stat. § (Rule) 809.71. Mr. Browner's petition does not fulfill this requirement. The court additionally notes that Mr. Browner is represented by counsel (Attorney Michael Queensland) in the ongoing criminal matter that appears to underlie Mr. Browner's petition, State v. Browner, Fond du Lac County Case No. 2022CF783. A copy of this order is being provided to Attorney Queensland.
