On May 19, 2025, Amarion Sharod Johnson, pro se, filed a document in this court captioned "Motion to Dismiss" relating to Milwaukee County Case No. 2024CF3797, in which he was convicted of armed robbery, first-degree reckless injury, and felon in possession of a firearm, as a repeat offender. Johnson's motion to this court alleges that his trial counsel was ineffective for a variety of reasons and that several of his constitutional rights were violated in the criminal proceeding.
