On October 8, 2021, a petition was filed by James D. Rogers, Government Affairs Director, on behalf of the Wisconsin Association for Justice. This rule petition asks the court to amend Wis. Stat. § 804.03 to allow remote administration of oaths at depositions, consistent with a series of temporary orders that permitted this practice during the COVID-19 pandemic.<sup>1</sup>

IT IS ORDERED that a public hearing on the petition shall be held in the Supreme Court Hearing Room in the State Capitol, Madison, Wisconsin, on Monday, April 11, 2022, at 9:30 a.m.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that notice of the hearing be given by a publication of a copy of this order and of the petition in the official state newspaper once each week for three consecutive weeks, and in an official publication of the State Bar of Wisconsin not more than 60 days nor less than 30 days before the date of the hearing.
