> This evening I again reviewed Commissioner Julie Anne Rich's memo of January 28, 2014, along with her attachment suggesting language for a Supreme Court Rule on creation, membership, staffing, duties and coordination with others for a Supreme Court Finance Committee. She indicated that she had used Justice Roggensack's proposed rule language as a template for her draft rule.

> Justice Roggensack deserves great credit for all of the work she has done on the proposal for a Finance Committee.

> In the hope that we might reach a unanimous agreement on such a Supreme Court Rule, when we meet on Wednesday I intend to offer a motion that we adopt Commissioner Rich's draft Rule.

> Now that the draft IOP has been withdrawn and all seem to agree that the mission of the Finance Committee is to provide

> information to the Supreme Court on the Biennial, Operational and Grant Budgets, it seems to me that true unanimous adoption of a Supreme Court Rule establishing the Finance Committee is within our reach.

> I sincerely hope that you will join me in voting for my motion.
