Re: Rule Petition 19-16, In the Matter of Amending Wis. Stat. § 802.05(2m) relating to

Ghostwriting, a Form of Limited Scope Representation

Greetings:

On January 17, 2020, the Wisconsin Supreme Court conducted a public hearing on rule petition 19-16 filed May 15, 2019 by Attorney James E. Goldschmidt, on behalf of Quarles & Brady, LLP. The rule petition asks the court to amend Wis. Stat. § 802.05(2m), to restore the rule to the version as originally created by the court. The petition asks the court to eliminate language added by the legislature in 2018 that imposed a requirement that lawyers who assist otherwise unrepresented persons in the preparation of documents include their name and State Bar number on the document.

During the public hearing, questions were asked and answered about the respective authority of the court and the legislature to act in this matter. In re Constitutionality of Section 251.18, 204 Wis. 501, 236 N.W. 717, 721 (1931), a case evaluating the constitutionality of the precursor to Wis. Stat. § 751.12, states inter alia, that: "it is concluded that the power to regulate procedure, at the time of the adoption of the constitution, was considered to be essentially a judicial power, or at least not a strictly legislative power, and that there is no constitutional objection to the delegation of it to the courts by the legislature." The court further reasoned that, since the legislature could delegate power, it could also take it back. Therefore, the court deemed the statute constitutional, ruling that the legislature did not offend the separation of powers doctrine by delegating and, at the same time, retaining the authority to regulate practice and procedure.

At the closed administrative rules conference following the public hearing, the court discussed this language. The question was raised whether the reference to a legislative delegation of power in the above-reference case, read in conjunction with Wis. Stat. § 751.12(4) (stating that "[t]his section shall not abridge the right of the legislature to enact, modify, or repeal statutes or rules relating to pleading, practice, or procedure"), implies that the court is constrained in its authority to essentially nullify a legislative act. But see John F. Jelke Co. v. Hill, 208 Wis. 650, 660, 242 N.W. 576 (1932) (stating "[i]n Wisconsin the jurisdiction and power of the courts is conferred not by act of the legislature but by the constitution itself. While the legislature may regulate in the public interest the exercise of the judicial power, it cannot, under the guise of regulation, withdraw that power or so limit and circumscribe it as to defeat the constitutional purpose.")

The court determined that it would benefit from additional briefing on this issue before rendering a decision on the rule petition. Therefore, it invites additional written comment from the petitioner on the question of the respective authority of the court and legislature to act in this matter. The court also requests briefing from the petitioner on the question of how the petitioner's alternative suggestion (that the court suspend the existing rule) would be accomplished procedurally. See Wis. Stat. § 751.12(2) ('[a]ll statutes relating to pleading, practice, and procedure may be modified or suspended by rules promulgated under this section.") Interested persons may also comment on these issues if they choose.

Supplemental comments to the rule petition should be limited to these issues and should be filed by February 4, 2020, with the Clerk of Supreme Court, Attention: Deputy Clerk-Rules, P.O. Box 1688, Madison, WI 53701-1688. Please also email a Microsoft Word version of your response to *clerk@wicourts.gov*. The court does not anticipate that it will accept responses to these supplemental filings. If the court requires additional information, the court will request it.
